Author Name, Institutional Affiliation, Physical Location (Constantia 12 pt Small Caps; remove this when initially submitting to preserve blind review)

Your abstract goes here. It should be no more than 90 words. (Constantia 12pt italics)

This is the beginning of your article. From here until the end of your article, everything except the headings and subheadings should be in Times New Roman size 12 font. All text (except the abstract and block quotes) should be double-spaced. Use 1" margins. Your initial paragraph and any paragraphs after a heading should not be indented.

This is your second paragraph. Ident this and all other paragraphs not following a

heading. Do not add extra space between paragraphs. "When quoting an author, use double

quotes and cite your source, usually following the Chicago Manual of Style."1

If you have a quote that takes up four lines or more of your paper, use a block quote. Still use 12-point font and single space the text. Magnus es, domine, et laudabilis valde: magna virtus tua, et sapientiae tuae non est numerus. Et laudare te vult homo, aliqua portio creaturae tuae, et homo circumferens mortalitem suam, circumferens testimonium peccati sui et testimonium, quia superbis resistis: et tamen laudare te vult homo, aliqua portio creaturae tuae.<sup>2</sup>

This is your second paragraph. Ident this and all other paragraphs not following a heading. Do not add extra space between paragraphs. "When quoting an author, use double quotes and cite your source, usually following the *Chicago Manual of Style*."<sup>3</sup> If you are regularly citing a source, "include the full citation in the first citation."<sup>4</sup> Thereafter, cite in-line (*abbreviation*, page number).
